Sergeant Thomas George Wareham 1884-1917

In St Mary's Church Corscombe, the war memorial to commemorate those local men lost in the 1914-1918 war, contains the name of Thomas Wareham who was the third son of William and Eliza Wareham both of whom were born in Corscombe in 1851. Thomas was killed in action on 30th November 1917.



The Remembrance Day Service this year is planned to be held in St Mary's (subject to confirmation in November). Ted Wareham, who is the nephew of Thomas, is hoping to take part in this service.

It is hoped that people of the village may like to attend to remember other village men who died in the same war.

Corscombe & Halstock Community First Responders

First Aid tip for the month:

If you have a smart phone, there are three apps that are worth downloading. They are free and give essential First Aid information and advice.

The apps are:

- First Aid - Red Cross app
- Baby and Child First Aid - Red Cross
- First Aid - St John Ambulance

Simply visit the App Store and download the relevant apps. These apps put information at your finger tips. Spending 5 or 10 minutes every few days browsing the information will give you a valuable source of learning, and will be available to consult in an emergency - not forgetting to call 999 if relevant (the 999 service will tell you what to do in an emergency).

£700 per year running costs

It costs the Responder Team about £700 per year to run. We have to purchase and run the First Responder vehicle, pay for fuel and repairs, and buy supplementary equipment not provided by the ambulance service. Our fund raising profile is as follows

- Support from Corscombe Fete - about £200 this year

- Support from Halstock Fete - £100 last year
- Donations
 - Thank you to the person who gift aided their winter fuel payment to us - £200 plus £50 gift aid from the Government
 - One off donations - totalling £35 and enhanced by £8.75 through Gift Aid
- **Fete De La Soupe (October 28th) when we hope to make a profit of £200**

We rely on support from the community so that we can, in turn, give emergency support to those in need. We have charitable status, enabling donations to be enhanced through the gift aid programme


Dr Guy Stevens



Dr Guy Stevens, son of Deborah Childs, has been awarded a *'Points of Light'* award for his conservation work. He founded the **Manta Trust**, the aim of which is to protect manta rays and related species, which are endangered due to fishing. The prime minister, Theresa May, has written to Guy in recognition of his internationally significant work. Guy said *'I am thrilled to receive the award for my work raising awareness of the threats facing manta rays. Manta are incredible animals; huge, graceful and very inquisitive, with the largest brain of any fish. Sadly, they are also extremely vulnerable, and are currently under grave threat from*

the fishing industry, so the Manta Trust's research and work to protect them is more important than ever'
