I know Sarah has been busy spending it for us on a tent and tarpaulins so that we can all be more comfortable if the weather is a bit challenging. This means that whatever the weather conditions we can continue to enjoy exciting play in the woods. I think we might also have been able to buy some new mallets, because everyone loves hammering sticks into the ground and there are never enough mallets to go round. We are also enjoying the new ropes which are great for transporting sticks around the woods and for making rope bridges. We continue to be really grateful to Sarah for running these fun sessions and to Henry and Rosemary who let us have free rein in their lovely woods.

Time passes so quickly and it is now Tesco Vouchers for Schools again so we are now asking everyone to save and collect their Tesco Vouchers for us once again. They can be handed to any member of staff or committee, or put in the plastic pocket in the village hall. Last year the local community did us really proud and we are still enjoying the new stepping stones, pattern makers and dancing ribbons which we managed to acquire through this scheme in 2010.

We were delighted to learn we have been successful in our bid for a county grant in order to replace and upgrade some of our very old and

worn out furniture. We asked for money to help improve our home corner and book corner in order to give the children a richer learning environment. We have also been able to buy some new tables and some outdoor equipment. This helps us to raise the standard of our play and learning, and make the environment more pleasant for both staff and children. We have also been able to address the need to have more resources for helping children to be better versed in using technology and for opening them up to understanding more about the world outside their own community. It is very satisfying to be able to make so much progress for the group. However we must continue to progress and improve and we still have a long wish list of smaller items that we need to raise money for.
