Major General Tim Cross addresses the troops of Melbury

“Winning hearts and minds” is key to being a good leader in the Army according to Major General Tim Cross, who headed the UK forces in Iraq. He also told the Melbury Men’s Breakfast of his reliance on models of good leadership in the Bible – citing Joshua as somebody who showed discernment and courage in leadership. Each of us is “dealt cards” at birth – these programme our Nature. But Nurture is how we play the cards and that means that we all have a lot of choice in what we do with our lives and how we relate to others. In describing how soldiers relate to each other – he used the terms “Duty”, “Integrity”, “Honour” and “Commitment”. “True Friendship” in the Army is knowing a colleague by name and missing them when they are not there. But he observes that these values are often missing from British Life and in many ways – we in Britain have “lost the plot”.

There are many criticisms of Christianity in modern times but our culture is based on Judaeo-

Christian values. These faiths have survived for thousands of years and we need to recognise their formative role in our society. Tim became a Christian when he was 30 years old and gave several examples of how that important decision has influenced his life subsequently. He had to make a decision on whether to focus only on commanding his troops in Bosnia or should he also get them to help the thousands of refugees from the civil war. He felt that it was right to organise his troops in humanitarian activities as well as their “traditional soldier” role. He challenged us all by describing a visit to the London Eye where he told his grandchild what politicians did for the country as he looked to Westminster and what finance people did for the country as he looked towards the city. His grandchild asked him, as he looked towards St Paul’s, what does the Church do for the country? What would we say?
