If you have been to the Hall recently you will probably have noticed that the old sign from The Quiet Woman Pub has been mounted on the wall in the entrance porch. If you have not seen it, do make a point of looking next time you are at the Hall. It has been restored by a professional pub sign writer and now looks wonderful. We are most grateful to the Village Trust as they have paid for the work to be carried out.

The possibility of having a hearing loop installed in the Hall has been raised. I would be very interested to hear comments from anybody as to whether this would be worth pursuing and whether you would find it a benefit.

I would like to remind users of the Hall that any damage should be entered in the record book which is kept in the kitchen and if necessary reported to a caretaker. At the beginning of February, a power socket in the passage outside the kitchen was found to be damaged. As the front of the socket was completely broken, there

were live wires exposed which could have proved to be very dangerous. There was no report of this damage.

There is a full size table tennis table in the Hall which is no longer needed. It is in reasonable condition and if you know of anybody who may be able to make use of it, could you please let me know.

Finally if you are thinking of having any double glazing or a conservatory installed, the Hall could benefit if this is carried out by Thermaglaze on a recommendation from the Hall. Again, if interested please let me know. Peter Brinck 01935 891822
